## 26 FUN FAMILY ACTIVITIES IN ST. LOUIS!

### FALL

1. Enter the Read, Right & Run Marathon's® official one mile family "Kick-Off" run/walk on September 23<sup>rd</sup> at Kiener Plaza in Downtown. The first 300 participants receive a free t-shirt.
2. During the month of October, look for the Pumpkin Prowls at the St. Louis Zoo.
3. Take a free public tour of Laumeier Sculpture Park during the first and third Sundays of October.
4. Go for a hike and take a picnic to Greensfelder Park. Be sure to stop by the Nature Learning Center.
5. Explore old-fashion automobiles, airplanes and trolleys at the Museum of Transportation.
6. Pet the llama's and walk past the Clydesdale's at Grant's Farm.
7. Go Apple picking at Eckert's Farm.

### WINTER

8. Check out a free History Museum exhibit.
9. Slide down a 3-story slide at the Magic House.
10. Take a historical journey back in time by touring the Old Courthouse in downtown St. Louis.
11. Explore the Black World History Museum, which depicts the lives and contributions of African-Americans in this country.

13. Drop by the Art Museum where Sunday's are geared towards family events.
14. Observe more than a thousand different butterflies floating around the Butterfly House.
15. Celebrate other cultures with a variety of hands-on activities at the Worldways Children's Museum.
16. Get a group of friend's together for a day or evening of ice-skating at Steinberg's Rink.
17. Visit the life-sized Tyrannosaurus Rex at the St. Louis Science Center.
18. Check out free family activities celebrating Black History Month at the St. Louis Public Libraries, the Museum of Westward Expansion (beneath the Gateway Arch) and other cultural attractions.
19. Challenge your fear of heights by spending an afternoon at the Upper Limits Climbing rock climbing gym.

## SPRING

20. Climb a tree or explore a cave at the Children's Garden located in the Botanical Gardens.
21. Breakout your camera and take pictures of you and your friends climbing around on Turtle Playground.
22. If the Cards game is sold-out, then visit the St. Louis Cardinals History Museum or the St. Louis Bowling Museum.
23. Rent a boat and paddle around the lake at the Boathouse in Forest Park.
24. Get a one of a kind view of St. Louis from the very top of the Arch.
25. Discover how Native Americans lived by touring the Cahokia Mounds.
26. Travel to the U-City Loop and read the names of all the local celebrities on the Walk of Fame.
